Chowder Party, Regatta Dance Attended by Many Colonists

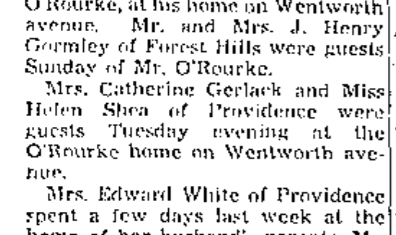
